Moscow – St Petersburg 11 days / 10 nights MS Rublev

Itinerary:

Moscow, Uglich, Yaroslavl, Goritsy, Kizhi, Mandrogi, St Petersburg. If the departure is from St. Petersburg, the program and the cities are inverted, but the excursions in the package are the same.

DAY 1: Arrival in Moscow

Arrive in Moscow, Russia's largest city. Upon arrival you will be met and escorted to your cruise ship. [D]

DAY 2: Moscow city sightseeing tour

After breakfast you will have a city tour which will include the Red Square, the views of St. Basil's Cathedral, the Lenin Mausoleum, Bolshoy Theater, the Olympic Stadium and many other points of interest. [B,L,D]

DAY 3: Visit to the Kremlin grounds and departure from Moscow

Your morning tour takes you to the Kremlin, the former seat of the Russian Government and a unique historical, architectural and artistic reserve. Visit one of the cathedrals situated on the grounds of the Kremlin at Cathedral Square. In the late afternoon, as your river cruise departs Moscow, join your ship's captain in a welcome dinner with champagne. [B,L,D]

DAY 4: Uglich: the Cathedral of Transfiguration and the Church of St. Dimitry on the Blood
Stop today at picturesque Uglich situated on the right bank of the Volga River. Visit the renowned green-domed Cathedral of Transfiguration perched at the water's edge. Next, visit the Church of St. Dmitry on the Blood, built on the site where Dmitry, the son of Ivan the Terrible, was murdered. [B,L,D]

Yaroslavl, an important Volga port is the next port of call. On your city tour, visit the 17th century Church of St. Ilya the Prophet, an incredible structure filled with frescoes and classic Russian architecture and wander the grounds of the 12th century Savior-Transfiguration Monastery, one of the Volga's oldest. DAY 6: Goritsy: the Kirillo-Belozersky Monastery

The ship arrives in Goritsy, set in the beautiful countryside. Tour the grounds of the well-preserved 14th century Kirillo-Belozersky Monastery, named in honor of its founder, the monk Cyril and one of the most honored saints in the Russian Orthodox Church. [B,L,D]

DAY 8: Mandrogi: a living museum of Russian folk culture, food and traditions

Today takes you to the picturesque village of Mandrogi located on the River Svir. A relaxing stop on the Verdant River Bank to enjoy the pleasant scenery and a traditional Russian shashlik (shish kebab) picnic lunch. This evening join your ship's captain in a farewell dinner with toast as your river sailing ends. [B,L,D]

DAY 9: Arrival in St Petersburg, city sightseeing tour and Saint Peter and Paul Fortress

This morning arrive and go on bus city tour in the great city St. Petersburg with its many palaces, once home to the Russian nobility, drive along Nevsky Prospect, the main boulevard of St. Petersburg lined with shops and baroque buildings. Take a view down Kanal Griboedova to the Church of the Savior on the Spilled Blood. Pass the Gostiny Dvor (the city's largest department store), the National Library and the monument to Catherine the Great. Visit to Saint Peter and Paul Fortress and to the famous baroque Cathedral designed by Domenico Trezzini, where are buried the Tsars and Tsaritsas of the Romanov Dynasty. [B,L,D]

DAY 10: Visit to the Hermitage State Museum and Catherine Palace in Pushkin

Visit at the Hermitage Museum. The rival of the Louvre in Paris, the Hermitage contains three million exhibits and early collections dating back to Catherine I. Visit of Catherine the Great's Palace, where the world-famous Amber Room is preserved, and walk in the magnificent Palace Park. Catherine's Palace, a faithful of the Italian rococo style motives in the typical Baroque Elizabethan architecture, was the summer residence of Russian Tsars in the town of Tsarskoye Selo, where Alexander Pushkin spent his youth. [B,L,D]

DAY 11: Departure from St Petersburg

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The Volga Fleet

MS Shurikov Built in Austria in 1975 and totally refurbished in 2007 this 4-deck vessel is equipped with sophisticated navigation devices and modern facilities. The total passenger capacity is 150 persons. There are 44 twin cabins with two lower beds, 2 single cabins

with one lower bed, 32 triple cabins with 2 lower and one upper beds, 4 junior suites. All cabins are outward-facing. Ship facilities: 1 restaurant, 2 bars, conference hall, medical office, souvenir kiosk, laundry (chargeable). Cabin features: air conditioner, bathroom (sink, shower, toilet), electrical socket (220V), built-in wardrobe.



MS Karamzin Built in Germany in 1981 and renovated in 2010 this 5-deck vessel is equipped with sophisticated navigation devices and modern facilities. The total passenger capacity is 240 – 260 persons. There are 100 twin cabins with two lower beds, 12 single cabins with one lower bed, 20 triple cabins with 3 lower beds, 12 junior suites and 2 two-room suites. All cabins are outward facing. Ship facilities: 1 restaurant , 1 bar-restaurant, 1 bar, conference hall with bar counter, reading room, medical office, 2 souvenir kiosks, laundry (chargeable). Cabin features: air conditioner, bathroom (sink, shower, toilet), electrical socket (220V), built-in wardrobe, refrigerator.



MS Krasin Built in Germany in 1989 and renovated in 2008 this 5-deck vessel is equipped with sophisticated navigation devices and modern facilities. The total passenger capacity is 260 persons. There are 126 twin cabins with two lower beds, 9 single cabins with one lower bed, 14 quads and 2 suites. All cabins are outward facing. Ship Facilities: 1 restaurant, 1 bar-restaurant, 1 bar, conference hall, reading room, medical office, 2 souvenir kiosks, laundry (chargeable). Cabin features: air conditioner, bathroom (sink, shower, toilet), electrical socket (220 V), built-in wardrobe, refrigerator.



MS Rublev Built in Germany in 1981 and completely refurbished in 2011 this 5-deck vessel is equipped with sophisticated navigation devices and modern facilities. The total passenger capacity is 240 persons. There are 100 twin cabins with two lower beds, 4 single cabins with one lower bed, 20 triple cabins with 2 lower and one upper beds, 20 junior suites and 2 suites. All cabins are outward facing. Ship facilities: 2 restaurants, 2 bars, conference hall with bar counter, medical office, souvenir kiosk, laundry (chargeable). Cabin features: air conditioner, bathroom (sink, shower, toilet), electrical socket (220 V), built-in wardrobe, refrigerator.



MS Lenin comfortable 4 deck vessel built in Germany in 1987. The MS Lenin is equipped with sophisticated navigation devices and modern facilities and has a maximum capacity of 272 passengers. There are 124 twin cabins, 10 single cabins, 7 bunk bed cabins and 1 junior suite. Ship facilities: sauna, 2 Bars, restaurant, sundeck, conference hall, souvenir shop, doctor's office. Cabin features: private bathroom, wardrobe, radio, refrigerator and air conditioning.



MS Russ comfortable 4 deck vessel built in Germany in 1987 and fully refurbished in 2012, equipped with sophisticated navigation devices and modern facilities. The total passenger capacity is 276 persons. There are 124 twin cabins, 10 single cabins, 4 bunk bed cabins and 2 junior suites. Ship facilities: sauna, 2 Bars, restaurant, sundeck, conference hall, souvenir shop, doctor's office. Cabin features: flat screen TV, private bathroom, hairdryer, wardrobe, radio, refrigerator and air conditioning.



MS River Viktoria Built in Germany in 1982 and totally renovated in 2011 this 5-deck vessel is equipped with sophisticated navigation devices and modern facilities. The total passenger capacity is 206 persons. There are 93 twin cabins, 2 presidential suites, 6 deluxe suites and 2 junior suites. All cabins are outward facing. Ship facilities: 1 restaurant, 1 bar, library, lounge (with bar counter), medical office, souvenir kiosk, laundry (chargeable). Cabin features: air conditioner, bathroom (sink, shower, toilet), refrigerator, electrical socket (220V), built-in wardrobe.
